Open Pollinated (O.P.) is a horticultural term meaning that the plant will produce seeds naturally. When these seeds are planted they will reliably reproduce the same plant as the parent. This means the farmer doesn't have to depend on just a few chemical/seed giants anymore!

Corn growers are discovering a host of benefits from growing O.P. corn versus high-dollar hybrids. Now they can grow their own seed...their own future! We've helped hundreds of farms begin their own seed banks.

You Should Know...

It is understood that stalk strength and yield are lower in O.P. corn. We speculate that is one of the reasons why we are seeing higher nutrition numbers. We are accomplishing our goal to select corn that will stand to harvest and yield well with high nutrition. "We are seeing improved standability with 10-25% higher proteins and test weights with O.P. corn versus standard high-dollar hybrids."

Saving seed puts more control in the hands of the grower. There are no patents or trademarks. Anyone can use it for seed if they are willing to put in the time and effort.

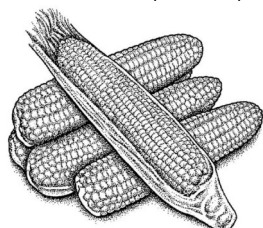

Green Haven obtained our first Super Sweet SH2 seed from Restoration Seeds of Oregon in 2016. Super Sweet SH2 corn was originally bred by Kultursaat in Germany (a non-profit plant breeding organization that contributes to the further development of agrobiodiversity in order to promote biological diversity). Kultursaat started the project in 2003 and Super Sweet SH2 was the result of a crossing of 40 SH2 hybrids. It is the only open pollinated SH2 variety that we know about from which you can save seed and will reliably reproduce.

In the mid 1800s, Robert Reid accidentally crossed "Gordon Hopkins," an old dent variety, with an early Native American flint called "Little Yellow." This "mistake" is the base of some of the most widely used genetics in corn production today.

A synthetic is a composite of a number of inbred lines that you can save seed from. Work on this synthetic population began in 2003. Synthetic varieties tend to be more uniform than other OPs. Its parents were inbreds that formed strong hybrids, and its our shortest season Synthetic. Revolt has Ga1s traits (see below for more info).

- This full season synthetic population derived from crosses among commercial and university corn belt dent inbred lines.
- Quite uniform
- Like Revolt, it has the Ga1s trait to discourage cross pollination from unwanted pollen.

Ga1s are naturally occurring traits in corn that will greatly reduce outcrossing with plants that don't carry the same trait. This trait is called gametophytic incompatibility. This trait helps prevent accepting unwanted pollen from transgenic and other field corn. Revolt and Rebellion are varieties with the Ga1s trait. They were developed by Dr. Frank Kutka and the Seed We Need Project with support from a grant from the Organic Farming Research Foundation. We appreciate Frank's fascinating work.

- No hulls to remove. Most oats have a clinging hull that requires expensive milling equipment to use them for human consumption. Hulless oats do not. In fact, hulless oats, like wheat, shed the hulls easily during the normal threshing process.
- Higher digestibility and protein for feed than common oats with a hull
- Medium straw
- Resistant to crown rust
- **FEED YOUR COMMUNITY!**
Hulless oats create an opportunity to feed a local community with good healthy, whole grain, high protein food without a big investment in expensive processing equipment.
- For cooking: soak in water. What little hull remains will float. Cook for oatmeal or grind for oat flour.
- Plant in early spring at 100-148#/acre, 2.5-3#/1000 sq ft

- Diploid meaning it has two sets of chromosomes. Modern wheat is a hexaploid containing six.
- Einkorn does not have the D chromosome, which seems to be connected with wheat intolerance in many humans with modern day wheat.
- Einkorn is one of the oldest cultivated cereal crops in the world. It contains only 14 chromosomes as opposed to 42 in modern wheat.
